Important Verse....

Day 1: Accepting Consequences....

Deuteronomy 3: 23-29 // THINKING POINTS: (1). When Moses misrepresented God and struck the rock twice to provide water for the people, what was God's punishment? (2). Does God punish us, allow us to experience the consequences of our choices, or both? (3). What lessons can you learn from this story in regards to accepting the consequences of your actions?

Day 2: Greatest Commandment....

Deuteronomy 6: 1-9 // THINKING POINTS: (1). Why do you think the command to "love God with all your heart, soul & strength" is the greatest of all the commands? (2). If you honestly loved God with your whole being, what do you think your life would look like? (3). What effects on your behavior would obeying this one commandment create?

Day 3: Greatest Prophet....

Deuteronomy 18: 15-22; 34: 10-12 // THINKING POINTS: (1). If God promised to raise up another "Prophet" greater than Moses, and Moses was unique because he was the only prophet of Israel to speak to God face to face, who can you conclude this Prophet is? (2). In what ways do you think Jesus was a prophet? (3). Apply this accordingly.

Day 4: Special People...

Deuteronomy 26: 16-19 // **THINKING POINTS:** (1). What was it that made these people (and you the believer) a special people before God? (2). Why did God call them (and you) to be a special people? (3). Does this role come without responsibilities.... what are they?

Day 5: Laws Gracious Provisions....

Deuteronomy 30: 1-10 // THINKING POINTS: (1). Though God allows us to experience the consequences of our actions, do you see God's grace by providing a way of return? (2). Have you allowed guilt and condemnation to pull you away from God? (3). How has God already demonstrated His grace towards you?

Day 6: Our New Leader....

Deuteronomy 31: 1-8 // THINKING POINTS: (1). Joshua faced a huge task following Moses' departure.... How did God encourage him? (2). How should the reality that God will "never leave us or forsake us" effect our current struggles and challenges? (3). The name "Joshua" in the Greek is "Jesus", how does Jesus lead us to the land of promise?



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
