Study Outline

Main Point: The book of Exodus is the story of how God delivers His people out of bondage, calls them to live lives of holiness, and leads them to a land of promise while displaying his power, provision & presence. Beyond the literal interpretation, Exodus can also be seen a picture of the lives we live in Christ. Jesus provided us “Freedom” through His work on the cross. Our freedom should result in “Obedience” to the delivery. And our obedience produces “Worship” as we commune in the presence of God.

Important Verse.....

“I am the Lord; I will bring you out from under the burdens of the Egyptians, I will rescue you from their bondage, and I will redeem you with an outstretched arm.... Day 1: Slaves in Egypt....

Exodus 1: 1-22 // THINKING POINTS: (1). What comparisons can you make to our sin and the concept of slavery? (2). How do you think the Israelites went from being free in Egypt to being slaves to Egypt? (3). The Egyptians were not kind to the people of God, how do you think this compares to the worlds treatment of the Christian?

Day 2: Holy Ground....

Exodus 3:1-5 // THINKING POINTS: (1). Why was Moses tending sheep in the back of the desert? (2). Why did God ask Moses to remove his sandals if the ground was holy? (3). Moses needed to experience God's forgiveness before he could be affectedly used by God, are there areas of your life needed to feel God's Holiness?

Day 3: I Do Hate Snakes....

Exodus 7: 8-13 // THINKING POINTS: (1). As illustrated in this story, do you reach the conclusion that Satan is powerful? (2). Though Satan is a powerful being, what does this story tell you about his power in comparison to God's? (3). If God dwells within you, what does this tell you about the temptations of Satan?

Day 4: Help I Cant Swim....

Exodus 14: 1-31 // THINKING POINTS: (1). Do you ever question God's goodness in the face of insurmountable odds? (2). What do you learn concerning God and His heart towards His people? (3). In what situations do you need God to intervene?

Day 5: Victory Over the Flesh....

Exodus 17: 8-16 // THINKING POINTS: (1). If Amalek represents the "Flesh" what lessons do we learn from this story? (2). Imagine Moses standing on the mount with his arms outstretched.... what scene in the NT does this remind you of? (3). Do you have friends that will lift up your arms when you're struggling.... who are they?

Day 6: The Golden Calf....

Exodus 32: 1-35 // THINKING POINTS: (1). If an idol is anything we give more importance than God, what do modern day idols look like? (2). Are there idols in your life.... materialism, relationships, TV, internet, education, etc? (3). What do you learn about the nature of God (especially in regards to our sin & idolatry)?
